OVERVIEW

Students choose an accelerated track to law school or a paralegal emphasis in the Bachelor of Law Studies degree program. Supervised by an attorney, paralegals apply knowledge of law and legal procedures to assist attorneys, clients, and business organizations by performing such tasks as conducting legal research; drafting legal documents; interviewing clients and witnesses; and assisting attorneys in depositions, hearings, and trials.
